

KERBSIDE COUNCIL CLEANUP – from NOVEMBER 11

If you need to get rid of bulky items that can't go in your bins, you need to schedule your Kerbside Clean Up, call into the Council office and book your spot. NO bookings will be accepted by phone.



Items we CAN collect

Furniture: tables, chairs, sofas, lounges, wardrobes, bookshelves, desks, drawers, cabinets, wooden bedheads, bedframes, bed slats and cots.

Rugs: cut into 1m lengths, roll and tie them with string or tape.

Outdoor furniture: glass tops or panels are not accepted.

Bulky goods: toys, strollers, prams, baby seats, suitcases, pots and pans.

Mattresses: in any size or condition, maximum of two per household.

Whitegoods: fridges (food removed, tape doors shut) washing machines, dryers, dishwashers, ovens (tape doors shut), metal heaters and hot water systems.

Sporting: pushbikes, weight benches, treadmills and dismantled trampolines.

Steel: ladders, loose pieces of steel or ironing boards.
Lawnmowers/Whipper Snippers: empty of fuel.
Barbecues: barbecues made from metal only (gas

bottles to be removed). **Bedheads and bedframes:** made from metal only.

Electronics: any item with a plug or power cord (remove battery).

Entertainment: TVs, computers, laptops, monitors, stereos, printers, gaming consoles, DVD players and video recorders.

Household: vacuums, toasters, mixers, blenders, kettles, heaters, irons, coffee machines, lamps and pedestal fans.



Items we CANNOT collect

Building material: asbestos, bricks, rubble, dirt, pipes, roofing panels, doors, plasterboard, floor or roof tiles, girders, timber, fencing or wooden pallets, bathtubs, kitchen cupboards and sinks.

Car products: car parts, car tyres, car batteries and engines.

Cement: stone or marble items: stone bench and tabletops, cement pot plants, cement bricks, other large stone or cement items.

Commercial waste: including large office printers.
General waste or recycling: bags of rubbish,
medical waste, food scraps, liquids or items that can
go in the yellow lidded recycling bin or green lidded
FOGO bin.

Chemicals: paints, oils, flammable liquids, poisons, pesticides, household and pool cleaners, motor oil, cooking oil, fluorescent lights, gas bottles or fire extinguishers.

These can be recycled at our CRC shed at the Waste Transfer Station.


Glass: mirrors and glass items, including furniture with glass tops or panels.

Polystyrene: including packaging, pool noodles and beans from bean bags.

Heavy items: large tree stumps, logs or trunks.
