Local Government Elections were held on 14 September 2024and congratulations to the elected Councillors for the term from January 2022 to September 2024.

These Councillors, at the Ordinary Meeting of Council held October 29th , 2024 undertook the official Oath/ Affirmation of Office.

At the same meeting Cr Carol Oataway was elected Mayor and Cr Martyn Quinn was elected Deputy Mayor. We wish Cr Oataway and Cr Quinn well in their roles. ### Hay Urban Digital Water Metering Project

Thank you to those who have completed the recent Hay Town Water Users survey. At present your water is delivered to your household and business by Hay Shire Council and metered at the water connection. The water use is then manually read by a Hay Shire Council staff member. As a household you then receive the invoice for your water use based on the water meter read. Hay Shire Council is one of the last councils in NSW to still do manual meter reads. This process is labour intensive and as a result takes a considerable amount of time to process.

Hay Shire Council is proposing to implement a digital metering system that would replace the current water meters with a digital meter to provide more accurate reads, reduce leaks and costs.

The digital meters will allow household or businesses to:

- Check their water at any time on their phone
- Accurately measure water use
- Identify water leaks or issues at the house or business any time on their phone
- Ensure efficient use of water

For example, as a household or business you will be able to identify if you have a leaking pipe, dripping tap or connection issue that costs you money, to help prevent any Bill shock that may occur.

The meters do not require electricity and use satellite internet and radio technology to provide up to date information to customers. Council is seeking funding to proceed with the project and there will no additional cost to rate payers. As part of the process, we will be conducting several community engagement sessions, with further details to be provided shortly.

# Changes to the **Food Standards** Code for food businesses

There are new food safety requirements for Australian food service, caterer and related retail businesses from **Friday 8 December 2023**.



Under Standard 3.2.2A - Food Safety Management Tools, businesses will need to implement 2 or 3 food management tools, depending on their activities:

Food service, caterer and related retail businesses in NSW need to meet new food safety requirements in the Australia New Zealand Food Standards Code (the Code).

The requirements apply to most businesses from 8 December 2023. Standard 3.2.2A aims to improve food safety by introducing 3 tools:

- Food Safety Supervisor (FSS)
- food handler training
- showing food is safe.

If you already have a current FSS, you will only need to ensure other staff who handle unpackaged, potentially hazardous food have appropriate skills and knowledge in food safety and hygiene. Higher-risk businesses must also be able to show they are managing key food safety risks.

For other businesses, all the requirements are new, such as for children's services that supply food, school canteens, supermarkets, greengrocers, deli's, coffee vendors that sell food, correctional centres and boarding schools.

The requirements do not apply to the handling or sale of food for fundraising solely for community or charitable causes, providing food free to the community, or to businesses licensed with the Food Authority.
