




# **Pool Project Update**

The redevelopment of the John Houston Memorial Pool is moving ahead smoothly, with demolition completed and detailed pool designs finalised. Construction has now entered the next phase, with the contractor initiating piering works, which are progressing well. All major contracts have been secured, and importantly, there are no outstanding large-scale cost uncertainties. The project continues to track on schedule and within budget, marking a major milestone for this highly anticipated community upgrade.

#### **Road Shoulder Patching Works**

Hay Shire Council wishes to advise that road shoulder patching works will be carried out along Lachlan Street by Council-appointed contractors. The works will occur on both sides of Lachlan Street, between Brunker Street and Macauley Street, at various locations. These works scheduled to take place between mid-May and mid-June 2025, weather permitting. Council apologises for any inconvenience caused and appreciates your patience and cooperation during this period.

#### **Access to Water Meters**

Property owners and residents are kindly reminded to maintain clear and unobstructed access to water meters located on their property. This ensures that meter readers can perform their duties safely and efficiently. Most residential properties are equipped with two water meters: one for raw (untreated) water and one for filtered (treated) water. Both meters must remain easily visible and free of debris, overgrown vegetation, or any obstructions. Your cooperation helps maintain accurate water usage readings and supports the smooth operation of local water services.



#### Two Renewable Energy Projects announced for Hay Local Government Area

Council welcomes the news that Pottinger Wind Farm (Someva/AGL) and Bullawah Wind Farm (BayWa r.e) have been granted access under the South West Renewable Energy Zone Access Rights Scheme, announced on the 23rd April 2025.

The developments will be the first to be developed since Hay was identified as the centre of the South West Renewable Energy Zone in November 2022.

The South West REZ will unlock a significant pipeline of large-scale renewable energy and storage projects, while supporting \$2.8 billion in private investment by 2030 in our region. At its peak, the South West REZ is expected to support over 2,000 construction jobs.

Council has consulted the community widely since the South West REZ was announced, with our team understanding what changes the community wants to see to ensure the economy, community and environment can adapt and thrive into the future. This includes priorities to support healthy and connected communities, a prosperous regional economy, sustainable development, and thriving ecosystems.
