



Showground Master Plan

Staff, in conjunction with the Showgrounds Management Committee, have developed a draft Showgrounds Master Plan for Council's information. The Hay Showgrounds is a vital community asset, and serves as a hub for agricultural events, equestrian activities, exhibitions, and social gatherings. The Master Plan provides a structured approach to the management, maintenance, and future development of the Hay Showgrounds. It outlines strategies to ensure that the site remains a valuable community asset, supports various activities and events, and is managed in an environmentally and financially sustainable

manner, in accordance with the gazetted purpose of the area. A list of actions has been developed to further enhance the community asset, and is represented in the pictures below. It is envisaged that these projects will cost approximately \$2,348,000.00, being largely supported by external funding and will be completed over a significant period of time. The Showgrounds Master Plan Version 2, dated May 2025, is currently on public exhibition for a period of 28 days and can be found on Council's Website. Sheds and Shipping Containers in Residential Areas Policy

A recent review of Council's Sheds and Shipping Containers in Residential Areas Policy has highlighted that minor amendments are required to the following:

- Eave height of outbuilding/shed need to be increased to 3.6m, and
- Advertising developments that do not meet the standards to no longer be compulsory.

The Policy is currently on public display with submissions received by 12th July 2025. Feedback is welcome and should be made to Hay Shire Council, 134 Lachlan Street, Hay.



Cemetery Policy

The Hay Shire Public Cemetery Policy has recently been reviewed and subsequently adopted at the May 2025 Council meeting, after a 28 day exhibition period where no public submissions where received.

The policy has been amended to reflect:

- The changes in the Cemeteries and Crematoria ACT 2013 No 15 and its regulations;
- The incorporation of the new developments in the cemetery, including the:
 - New Lawn Cemetery
 - The Cross Columbarium
 - The Memorial Bridge
 - The Pet Memorial

The amended policy caters for natural burials, however an area for this has not been developed at present. The policy amendments also include a variety of other issues including parking on graves, overnight camping in the reserve and animals on graves.
