HOW TO USE THE CADDY & LINERS

1 Line kitchen caddy with Council approved compostable liner.



2 Place food scraps in your lined kitchen caddy.



3 Place filled liner into your green lidded organics bin.



- Use only council provided liners
- Be careful with the liners, they are designed to break down so may rip if they are opened roughly
- Keep your liners out of direct sunlight so they don't break down before you get to use them
- Empty your caddy every couple of days
- Wash out your caddy every now and then to reduce odours

When you run out of compostable liners you can place food and garden waste straight into the green lidded bin.

1 NUMBERING



Put your number on your bin, especially if you are in a unit complex.

2 TIMING



Put your bins at kerbside for collection the night before or by 6am on the morning of collection.

3 NOT TOO CLOSE



Place your bins away from overhanging trees and parked cars, as these get in the way of the truck.

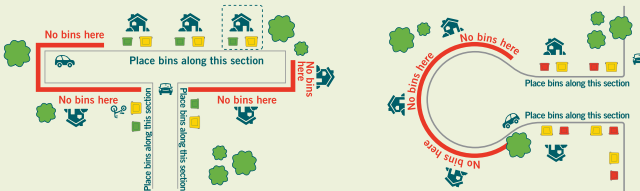
4 DON'T OVERFILL



The bin lid must be closed for collection. The truck's mechanical arm cannot lift overfilled bins. Extra items placed on top of next to the bin will not be collected.

5 BIN PLACEMENT

Close to kerb – at least **1 metre apart** and away from trees, cars, and other obstructions. Wheels towards the property.



6 CONTAMINATION

The wrong items placed in bins could contaminate whole truck loads of material collected for recycling. If contamination is on-going, your council will have no options but to withdraw your service.

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

According to waste audits conducted in your region in 2021, food and garden waste makes up 51% of the waste materials in an average household red lidded general waste bin. This fills up our local landfills and wastes a valuable resource.

By using your new green lidded bin for all your food and garden waste, your waste will be turned into compost for our farms, parks and gardens.

Some residents are moving from 1 bin or no kerbside collections to a 3 bin service. We understand its a big change for households and the Halve Waste team is working across your communities to help everyone with the changes.

We understand this may not suit everyone's needs. We have a range of options available. Contact your local council to discuss.

Councils are required to provide FOGO collection services to all households by 2030.

All councils have received funding through the NSW Government to educate and engage their communities about the introduction of the Food and Garden Organics services.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I MOVE?

When moving homes, leave your bins, caddy, and liners behind. These items are meant for the specific property and should stay there for the new occupants to use.

YOUR NEW 3 BIN SYSTEM



WHAT IS THE NEW 3 BIN SERVICE?

As part of your kerbside waste and recycling system your council, together with Halve Waste and your bin collection contractor are introducing the 3 bin system. Food and garden wastes are composted in our region and returned to agriculture and our parks and gardens. Recycling household packaging makes better use of resources and these all help to create more jobs regionally. Three kerbside bins (General Waste - Red lid, Recycling - Yellow Lid and Food and Garden Organics - Green lid) have been provided for you along with a kitchen caddy and compostable liners.

WHAT DO I NEED TO DO?

Simply place your food scraps and garden organics into the green lidded organics bin for weekly collection. Having a separate bins in your kitchen makes it easy to separate recyclable items inside your home. Refer to your supplied magnets for what goes in each bin.

HOW HAVE MY BIN COLLECTIONS CHANGED?

The green lidded organics bin will be collected weekly. The red lidded general waste bin will be collected fortnightly on alternate fortnights to the yellow lidded recycling bin. See your collection calendar for which bin goes out each week.
